

# Transition at a Glance

## Part C - Ages Birth to Three

### **Eligibility:**

To qualify, a child needs to show a need in 1 area or have a condition known to cause delays

### **IFSP**

Individual Family Service Plan  
\*family driven needs  
written annually  
reviewed every 6 months

### **Team:**

Service Coordinator, providers and family

### **Service Model:**

Interventions/services embedded into family routines in your home/daycare setting.

### **Who provides service:**

Benton-Stearns Ed District provides Homebased services on behalf of our 6 member districts

## Part B -Ages 3-5

### **Eligibility:**

To qualify, a child needs to show a need in 2 areas, or have a condition AND demonstrate an educational need

### **IEP**

Individual Education Plan  
\*educational based goals  
written annually  
reviewed as often as general ed students receive report cards

### **Required team members:**


Administrator, Parents, General Ed Teacher, Special Ed Teacher

### **Service Model:**

Services are embedded in the least restrictive environment (general education classroom, small groups, resource rooms)

### **Who provides service:**

Services are provided by staff in your local school district.



### Transition Meeting (between ages 2.3 and 2.9)

- Explain transition process to parents
- Determine if a Part B evaluation is needed and timelines for completion.
- Answer questions parents may have

### Evaluation and Planning (between 2.9-3 yrs)

- Complete the Part B evaluation & determine eligibility
- EI service coordinator will contact school based team to set up a meeting to discuss results and plan for age 3 programming. Evaluation Report and IEP is written.
- If Child is not eligible for Part B service, Service Coordinator will make referrals to other EC programs available.

### Age 3

- Child's casemanagement transfers to the school district case manager
- Depending on the time of year, your child may start centerbased programming. The School District is now responsible for programming/services. (exception - late spring/summer months, homevisits may continue).
- Family is asked to complete Family Outcome Survey and mail to the MN Department of Education, your EI teacher will give you a stamped envelope to do so.
